The Impact of War

Opening exercise

Go to Wikipedia.org and print out a picture of U.S. soldiers in Fallujah, Iraq (See: en.wikipedia.org/wiki/Second_Battle_of_Fallujah). Invite the students to view the photo for several minutes, close their eyes and imagine themselves exposed to danger in that setting for days on end. After a time of silence, invite them to reflect on how that exposure might make them feel in the immediate setting, and how it might affect them long-term.

View the video, "The Impact of War" (5:44)

Questions for reflection

- Invite students to react to the video. What do they wonder about? What they want to remember?
- Invite students to reflect on whether they have ever doubted God ... and why. What is there about war that would lead people, including soldiers like Ben, to doubt God?
- Invite students to say what they know about Post Traumatic Stress Disorder (PTSD). Using the resources listed below, explain PTSD more fully. Note that PTSD is not a sign of weakness. It is a normal, human response to trauma.
- Invite students to consider this question: Is the PTSD experienced by soldiers their individual problem, or is it a burden that we all share? Explain.

Biblical reflection

Read Psalm 38:5–11. Note that it was shared with a therapist by a Vietnam War veteran who said that the Psalm describes how he feels. Read Numbers 31:19, noting that even in the Old Testament, there was an acknowledgement of the need to heal from the trauma of war.
