Lebanon has been an economic crisis since 2019. And the banking system is -- we have practically no banking system. So what I want to say is, like all the savings are in the houses. So it's not when you flee if you don't take your money, that means all your savings have been bombed. So this is why it's even more, drastic on people.

Because, like, even when, hopefully when the war and so on, you're not going to have anything. If you lost everything at your home that mean you lost everything. You don't have anything in backup in banks or whatever. So this is another level of disaster if you want to say, because it's one disaster after the other. So it's all accumulating.

Some areas have been destroyed completely. So you're talking about thousands of thousands of people with no homes to go back to. Even after hopefully the war will end soon, there's going be to be huge, huge needs. You're taking again hundreds of thousands of people with nowhere to go back.
